### Role Summary

We are seeking passionate and experienced practicing clinicians who are driven to improve prostate cancer services in their area and make a meaningful difference for men living with prostate cancer.

With leadership development, improvement knowledge, peer support and support from Prostate Cancer UK, Clinical Champions will be expected to drive improvement through a project which they will develop during their 18 months in post.

Prostate cancer is now the most commonly diagnosed cancer in men. We want every man with or at risk of prostate cancer to have access to the same high-quality diagnosis, treatment and support, no matter where in the UK he lives. To do this we want to identify and invest in clinical leaders who will transform prostate cancer care.

#### As Clinical Champion you will receive

- Individual support from a member of the programme faculty to advise and support your improvement ambitions.
- Training on change leadership, system leadership, improvement science and implementing an improvement project.
- Virtual improvement group meetings that allow time to connect with peers, gather insight and space for reflection.
- Opportunities to meet other inspiring leaders.

- Individual development feedback and support from the programme faculty between modules.
- Networking, sharing insights and learning from fellow Champions.
- Support from Prostate Cancer UK during and beyond the programme.

### What we are looking for

Demand for places on this programme is consistently increasing and to maintain the quality and integrity of the programme, there is a finite number of people that can be accepted on to the 2022 – 2023 cohort. Successful candidates will be selected on the basis they meet the following criteria:

- Personal and professional dedication to high quality prostate cancer care for men
- Enthusiasm for, and commitment to, improving prostate cancer care
- Detailed knowledge of prostate cancer care
- Potential to lead and influence change
- Capacity for reflective learning and introspection
- Willingness to learn from peers
- An improvement project in line with Prostate Cancer UK's key priority areas
- Ability to commit to the time and demands of the programme
- In a permanent or fixed term role in the NHS during the programme
- Support from a Senior Executive to undertake this role

### We will also take the following into account when recruiting:

- The diversity of the group, ensuring there is representation from different professions, areas of the UK and levels of experience.

- Balance between ambition and achievability of your improvement project.
